## **Meet Member Susan Coolidge**

When Susan Coolidge moved to Newburyport a year and a half ago, her daughter, who lives in Brooklyn, NY, expressed some concern about her decision to move even further away from her and her two grandsons. But Susan is actively involved in the Joppa Flats Education Center and was weary of the commute from Cambridge. She

also wanted to live in a smaller, walkable city. And she loves the area's tidal marshes and for a time made her old camp in the Rowley marshes her home, where she had to plan her arrivals and departures around the supermoon tides.

It is not surprising that Susan

would become so involved with our area's environmental riches and want to move closer to our area. She has a master's degree in Environmental Science and taught children natural science for a total of 38 years in Beverly, Indiana, and Cambridge. She loved taking kids outside to dig around in nature. Now she also takes art classes and paints in oil, is active in local politics, and is an accomplished gardener. She's written a children's book that she illustrated herself. She prefers old houses, like the Victorian she has now, where she brought her antique claw-foot tub and a soapstone sink.

When we asked Susan why she joined the Village, she said, "My daughter is comforted that I am part of a supportive community." For Susan, Newburyport is a right-sized city for all that she enjoys, and she finds the Village a great way to make new friends while enjoying outdoor, educational, and social events.
