The Village Talk on August 16 features local writer Dyke Hendrickson speaking on "Nautical Newburyport: A History of Captains, Clipper Ships and the Coast Guard"—the title also of his fourth book.

Dyke Hendrickson is a journalist and author with a love of history. He has been with *The Daily News* for about 5 years, during which time he wrote a 27-

part series on the city's 250th anniversary.


Nautical Newburyport: A History of Captains, Clipper Ships and the Coast Guard is an overview of our community's waterfront, focusing on the period from 1764 to 1915.

His talk, beginning at 1 pm at the Newburyport Senior/Community Center, is certain to be interesting and entertaining.
