Will's parents came to Newburyport in 1933. After Sherry and Will moved here in 1972 and started a family, four generations of Rogers were living together in the same house.

Four accomplished international musicians will come together to form a string quartet presenting three concerts at local churches and three intimate evenings of "Hausmusik" in private homes. Along with the joy of hearing really good musical performances right in our own town, Sherry finds the free open rehearsals and panel discussions help her learn more about chamber music and how musicians work together. With a spirit of collaboration local citizens host the musicians and local businesses and institutions host the free events. On July 17 come hear Graham McKay, Marine Archeologist, Boat builder, and Executive Director of Lowell's Boat Shop in Amesbury talk about the history and evolution of whaleboats and whaling. Graham oversees the museum operations, program offerings, and boatbuilding operations. He teaches boatbuilding classes and instructs the museum's high school Apprentice Program, which he created as part of the Boat Shop's involvement with Mystic Seaport's restoration of the whaleboat *Charles W. Morgan* in 2012.

We'll see and learn about boats currently under construction and experience the museum of 200-plus years of history told through video and exhibits. Among others, we'll learn about the Banks Dory, which at one point was built by the thousands each year!
